Architecture in the Schools (AIS) is a unique curriculum enrichment program that matches the professional skills of architects with the talents of teachers in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area public school system.

The program is designed to work in a wide range of subject areas and has been successful in over sixty classrooms, ranging from first to twelfth grade.

The architects visit their classrooms once a week throughout one semester, providing an enhanced classroom experience for the students and demonstrating how the design of the built environment affects every aspect of their lives.



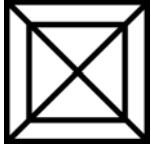
By the end of the program, the students have a completed project to show for their efforts, and the teachers have gained enough experience to recreate the program.

Both the teachers and the architects attend progress meetings and training sessions to increase their skills as professionals.
